### Haras du Berlais lands Behoor Al Shahania for €72,000

After a thrilling 16-minute bidding battle, Haras du Berlais secured Behoor Al Shahania for €72,000, a well-bred filly offered out of training by Al Shahania Stud. The two breeding sessions achieved a 65.5% clearance rate and a total turnover of €414,000.

#### €72,000 for Behoor Al Shahania

A bold move for **Haras du Berlais**, who invested in a **four-year-old filly out of training** consigned by **Al Shahania Stud**. A daughter of **Amer**, Behoor Al Shahania had earned a placing on the track, but her **exceptional pedigree and strong physique** made her a highly desirable prospect. She is a **full sister to Group 1 winner Amyr du Soleil**, and a **half-sister to Group 3 winner Haka du Soleil** and **Group 2-placed My Belle du Soleil**. Her dam is a **full sister to Dormah de Brugère and Dormadora**, making this a family steeped in top-class bloodlines.

**Jean-Marc Lucas (Haras du Berlais):** *"I bought her with my son. I know this family very well — it's from the foundation of the Arabian breeding programme I established years ago. It's the family of Bergeronnette, with a strong genetic base. Her brother Amyr du Soleil won the Prix Nefta — one of my early purchases — it feels like fate. We may send her to Azadi or Munjiz, but the decision isn't final yet."*



#### Etehad Al Shahania – Group 1 performer sells for €45,000

A dual winner and **fifth in the Qatar Arabian Trophy des Juments (Gr.1)**, **Etehad Al Shahania** (Af Al Buraq) was sold out of training by Al Shahania Stud for **€45,000** to **Zied Romdhane**. *"This purchase is for a Libyan client who appreciated both the*



American dam line and the sire **Af Al Buraq**, now standing at €25,000. We'll take some time to decide on her future plans."

#### **A touch of America with Rewaya**

With her **distinctly American bloodlines**, **Rewaya**, the first foal out of **dual Group 3 winner RB Madeline Kate**, caught the eye of **Raynal Frères**, who secured her for **€36,000**. The filly by **Muraaqib**, from the family of **RB Burn**, was consigned by **Haras de Thouars**, where she will remain.

**Hugo Raynal:** "She's a lovely filly by **Muraaqib**, a promising sire whose first runners are already making an impact. Her dam is top-class, a five-time winner. This first foal has a superb pedigree and a live family — she'll stay here in France."

#### **Desirade Al Nadeem to Liwa Stables for €30,000**

The striking **chestnut yearling by Muraaqib**, **Desirade Al Nadeem**, sparked strong bidding before being knocked down for **€30,000** to **Liwa Stables**. Out of a daughter of the champion **Areej** (winner of the Arabian World Cup), she hails from a deep and productive family. The filly will head to **Haras de Thouars**.

#### **Manarah – a broodmare prospect with bold credentials**

Presented by the **Royal Cavalry of Oman**, **Manarah (Madj Al Arab)** was purchased by **Abdulaziz Elkelbash** for **€30,000**. A winner and **Group and Listed-placed**, she is a sister to **Group winners Worood and Kareem**.

#### **Nabeel – a €25,000 yearling for Beverley Deutrom**

From **Haras de la Barbottière**, **Nabeel**, a yearling colt by **Al Mamun Monlau**, out of the **Listed-placed and Group 2 fourth Ellie du Paon**, sold for **€25,000** to **Beverley Deutrom**.

**Beverley Deutrom:** "We really liked his conformation and overall presence. He's strong, athletic, with excellent depth and balance. His family has performed very well in the Middle East — we might keep him in training in France."

#### **Haras de Thouars secures Gazwan's full sister**

A rare opportunity in the ring — the **full sister to champion and sire Gazwan** was purchased for **€12,000** by **Haras de Thouars**, consigned by **Al Shahania Stud**.

**Anthony Cessac:** "We bought her for an owner who wanted to invest in the bloodline of **Arc de Ciel**, a proven family producing multiple black-type horses. We hope to breed some exciting foals from her and are already planning the matings for 2026."
