



## AUCTAV ARABIAN SUMMER SALE

### Turnover Exceeds €600,000

**In a sale featuring numerous profiles aimed at the Gulf region, four lots reached or exceeded €20,000, generating €220,000 for this session alone. Across all three sessions, the sale concluded with 47 horses sold, representing 64% of those offered, for a total turnover of €625,500 at the Auctav Arabian Autumn Sale.**

**Hera d'Haspel** was purchased for **€27,000** by **Ahmed Aldhaheri**. Consigned by Al Cem Stud, the two-year-old filly hails from the family of *Kanaille du Faust*, who recently impressed with a strong win in Morocco. Her new owner was drawn to the strength of her maternal pedigree and confirmed that she will be exported to the **UAE** to continue her racing career.

The two-year-old **El Harith**, consigned by Haras du Grand Courgeon, was secured for **€27,000** by **Jassim Alatteya**. His dam, a Group and Listed-placed performer, is a sister to several winners including the talented *Yucattan* and *El Djal*. The colt will soon head to **Qatar**.

Trained by François Rohaut, **Lisaili** is a lightly-raced three-year-old whose promising first runs and attractive pedigree appealed to **Zied Romdhane**. Her dam, a dual Group 3 winner, has already produced two winners.

"Lisaili may be sent straight to stud," explained Zied Romdhane. "We are considering running her once on the dirt in Libya beforehand, just to test her."

Romdhane also purchased two additional lots in this session:

- **Al Hakeem** (€8,500), by Al Mouwaffak, who will remain in training
- **Al Taouy** (€19,000), currently trained by Charles Gourdain

"A son of Al Mourtajez at this price is an excellent buy. Al Taouy has a stallion's pedigree. We'll be patient with him—this is not a precocious family, but a lineage full of talent."

Finally, **Jabra'an Al Shahania** was purchased by **Mubarak Alnuaimi**, who pushed bidding to **€20,000** for the three-year-old trained by Thomas Fourcy. The colt's dam, a sister to *Nymphea du Paon* and *Darius du Paon*, has already produced a winner from her first foal.

"He has a strong pedigree, and I think he's perfectly suited to dirt racing in Qatar," noted Mubarak Alnuaimi.
