



Auctav Arabian Summer Sale Breeding Focus: strength in depth and quality pedigrees

The first Arabian sale of the year in France takes place on 25 June on <u>auctav.com</u> with the Auctav Arabian Summer Sale. Over 30 lots feature in the current catalogue, with a particular spotlight on quality broodmares and breeding prospects, including stallion Nour Hady.

Nour Hady (Dahess x Nour Hadya) – 2018 stallion - Consigned by Haras du Grand Courgeon

Nour Hady, a son of Dahess bred by Écurie Zakaria Hakam, is one of the standout performers of his generation in Morocco. A **nine-time winner**, he landed the highly coveted **Grand Prix SAR le Prince Héritier Moulay El Hassan (Gr.3 PA)** and has proven remarkably consistent at the highest level.

Most recently, he produced a dominant display in the **Prix Moulay Abdellah** at Anfa, where he surged clear to win by **seven lengths**, underlining his class and ability to separate himself in the key moments of a race.

Trained by **Éric Legrix** and partnered with leading Moroccan rider **Zouhair Madihi**, he offers a complete profile: toughness, cruising speed, stamina, and racecraft. From a strong maternal line, he is out of **Nour Hadya** (by Nour Thabet), an international winner herself, and closely related to **Al Noury** and **Wall Street**, both Group PA winners on the international stage.

With a proven pedigree, outstanding race record, and a versatile racing profile, **Nour Hady** presents a rare opportunity on the Arabian stallion market—a true Group-class performer with the credentials to make an impact both at stud and abroad.

Djeldora (Dormane x Djelifa) - 2007 mare in foal to Gazwan

Consigned by Al Cem Stud

A daughter of the exceptional Dormane, Djeldora raced in the iconic colours of Al Shahania Stud under the care of Julian Smart. She is the dam of **Goumoh** (by Jaafer ASF), a multiple winner and third in the **Qatar Arabian Trophy des Poulains (Gr.1 PA)** at Saint-Cloud. Her progeny also include **Hathlool** (winner in Qatar), along with the consistent performers **Dastour** and **Zomoreda Al Shahania** (by Gazwan), who placed both in France and Qatar. Djeldora is currently in foal to **Gazwan**, a stallion noted for producing tough and talented progeny with notable consistency.

Chloé Marchandet, Al Cem Stud: "This Dormane mare has great size and conformation, and hails from a 100% French damline that crosses well with a wide range of stallions. It's a rare genetic profile on today's market, with group-level performers across multiple countries. She is confirmed in foal to top-class sire Gazwan."

Badawiyah (Munjiz x Safa) - 2014 mare in foal to Ebraz

Consigned by Haras de Gouffern

By Munjiz and in foal to the much-anticipated **Ebraz**, this mare is a half-sister to **Akmar**, a Group 2 winner in Qatar and a model of consistency with over **10 podium finishes** and **31 placings in the top five**. This is a deep and proven family line that includes names like **Al Fatih**, **Rasheeqah**, **Zamaa**, **Nizam**, and further back, the legendary **Dahess**.

Jean-Pierre de Gasté, Haras de Gouffern: "She's a broodmare with strong frame and produces good-looking horses. Ebraz is stamping his foals with outstanding conformation—we already have foals and yearlings showing real quality. A double opportunity here: a top-class broodmare in foal to a stallion destined for the top."

Tara des Sables (Dahess \times Didja des Sables) – 2016 mare in foal to Muraaqib, with filly foal at foot by Mounjared Al Cham

Consigned by Stéphane Chazel

This is a live and productive family: **Mustawli**, who recently finished fifth on debut for Thomas Fourcy, is out of a sister to **Didja des Sables**, dam of Tara des Sables. The maternal line also includes **Aristote du Croate**, a Group 2 winner in Morocco, along with winners such as **Unprince du Croate**, **Opale du Croate**, **Jade des Pins**, and **Djavius des Landes**. Close relations also include **Al Doha**, a five-time winner and triple Group 1 scorer, runner-up in a Group 1 as recently as February 2025 in Qatar. Her filly foal is by **Mounjared Al Cham**, a son of **Azadi**. **Stéphane Chazel**, **écurie Hipolyte**: "Tara des Sables is a well-bodied mare. Her filly is her first foal and already shows good limb structure and an impressive stride. I've always liked Azadi, which is why I chose Mounjared Al Cham to bring speed into this Dahess line. She is confirmed in foal to **Muraaqib**, the leading speed sire not carrying Amer blood."

Déesse des Vialettes (Madjani x Starlette D'Vialettes) – 2013 mare with colt foal by

A race-winning daughter of the own sister to **Ténor des Vialettes**, Déesse des Vialettes is offered with a strong colt foal by **Ebraz**, whose eagerly awaited first crop are yearlings in 2025. **Alexandra Saint-Martin, on behalf of the owner**: "Déesse des Vialettes consistently produces well-framed, strong and tall foals with good movement and a willing attitude. Her 2025 colt by Ebraz fits the mould—he's correct, serious, and physically well developed."

Olia des Vialettes (Af Albahar x Déesse des Vialettes) – 2024 filly Consigned by Haras de Gouffern

This smart yearling is by **Af Albahar**, a cornerstone sire in Arabian breeding, and out of **Déesse des Vialettes**, herself a winner and from the family of **Ténor des Vialettes**.

Alexandra Saint-Martin, on behalf of the owner: "Olia des Vialettes is a quality filly with excellent balance. She's developing very nicely and shows strong, fluid movement, a calm temperament, and great adaptability."

Evora (No Risk Al Maury x Eauverdose) – 2021 filly, out of training -Consigned by Haras du Grand Courgeon

A 4-year-old recently out of training, **Evora** boasts an excellent pedigree. Her dam **Eauverdose**, though unraced, is a full sister to **Khataab** (Group 1 PA winner), **Mukatel Al Shahania** (Group 3 PA winner), and **Djelamer**, a Listed winner and Group 1 PA-placed performer.

Evora represents an exciting broodmare prospect from one of the most accomplished and active families in the Arabian racing world.
