Two rare breeding prospects join the Auctav catalogue, including the sister of Al Fahda

Hassan Mousli continues to enhance the breeding section of the Auctav Arabian Autumn Sale, scheduled for November 6th. On Auctav.com, you'll have the opportunity to bid on the sister to champion Al Fahda or the descendant of the excellent Al Nachmiya.

HM Jaziah, sister to Al Fahda

HM Jaziah has it all. A daughter of the highly sought-after stallion Al Mourtajez, this 4-year-old mare is out of Al Mazina, an heir to Dormane and a full sister to black-type Al Mouzna and half-sister to Al Chyhanah (by Munjiz), whose progeny recently made headlines with HM Al Zalmaa, winner of the Qatar Arabian Trophy des Pouliches (Gr.1). HM Jaziah's immediate family has excelled both on the track and in endurance. On French racecourses, Al Fahda (by Azadi) claimed victory in the Qatar Arabian Trophy des Pouliches (Gr.1) and secured numerous podium finishes in Group races. HM Jaziah is in foal with her first offspring, naturally by Azadi, a proven cross in this family. "It's a breeding that works very well with this lineage," says Hassan Mousli. "HM Jaziah shares similar behavior with Al Fahda—she's spirited but not difficult. Physically, she resembles Arwa, the dam of Al Mourtajez. She is is very well built. She was made for the racetrack but even more for breeding, with great depth."



HM Nachmah, with royal lineage

HM Nachmah (by **Al Mourtajez**) is a young filly recently out of training. At 4 years old, this race-placed filly is ready to join the breeding ranks and continue the successful genetic legacy of her family. Her dam is the full sister to **Al Nachmiya**, winner of the **Qatar Arabian Trophy des Pouliches (Gr.1)** and two Group 2 races, before producing Group winners and Group 1 performers **Al Haffanah**, **Meethag**, and **Mwarid**, as well as Group 2-placed **Al Sheeh**. The females of this family have consistently delivered top-class offspring, and there is much yet to be written for HM Nachmah.

"It's the same lineage as the previous filly, since, like HM Jaziah, she descends from **Aiglantine**, though from a different branch. Her dam, **Douhha Al Cham**, was brave: even with limited experience, she placed 4th in the **Qatar Arabian Trophy des Pouliches (Gr.1)**. HM Nachmah showed a bit of eagerness, so I've decided to focus her on breeding, despite her obvious talent on the flat. As for the stallion choice, if it were up to me, I'd look beyond French stallions and consider Saudi sires."
